Safety

Please assess your child's health BEFORE coming to school each day.

Students will remain with their assigned classmates throughout the day (ex: lunch, recess, specials, etc.)

All kindergarten students will enter and exit through their individual classroom doors.



Students will use individual supplies in the classroom setting.

Students will wash hands frequently, and use hand sanitizer throughout the day.

As weather allows, we will incorporate learning time outside.

High touch surfaces will be cleaned regularly.

Supplies

KINDERGARTEN

- 1 box of 24 count Twistable Mini Crayola crayons
- 1 set of Crayola watercolor washable markers
- 4 Expo dry erase markers (broad tipped, any color)
- 6 large glue sticks (.77 oz.)
- Watercolor paints, Prang brand LABEL WITH NAME
- 2 black Sharpie pens, fine tip (not ultra fine)
- 1 box of Kleenex brand tissues
- Headphones (no earbuds)
- 1 spiral notebook – wide ruled (8" x 10 ½")
- 1 box Ziploc quart size bags (zip or slide)
- Full size Backpack LABEL WITH NAME

Pencil Box (get size closest to these measurement 8.4x5.5x2.4 inches LABEL WITH NAME

Scissors-Fiskars 5 " (if you have a left-handed child, get a "leftie" scissors. LABEL WITH NAME.

The students will NOT be sharing personal supplies. Each child will be given a bin and chair bag to keep their items in throughout the day. Please label ALL items.

Lunch and Snack



- All students will eat lunch in their individual classrooms at their own table/desk.

- Two Choices:

1. Bring a lunch from home
2. Order school lunch

(Teachers will take the lunch count in the morning and lunches will be delivered to each classroom)

This year, all elementary students will be eating lunch and snacks in their classrooms. To ensure a safe dining experience for all students, foods with peanuts and tree nuts cannot be brought to school. There are many students with life threatening food allergies and exposure to a peanut or tree nut product puts many students at risk of anaphylaxis. We need your help to keep everyone safe.

- Do not send snacks or lunches that contain peanuts, almonds, cashews, hazelnuts, pistachios or walnuts.
- Please read labels carefully to make sure that products are peanut and nut free. Products with labels that read “May contain traces of peanuts/nuts” or “Manufactured in a plant that processes peanuts/nut products” are not allowed.
