#### Resignation, Return to Work, and Grievance Settlement Agreement

This Resignation, Return to Work, and Grievance Settlement Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Corinne Graham ("Graham"), the Edina Administrative Council ("the Union"), and Independent School District No. 273, Edina ("the District").

WHEREAS, the Union and the District are Parties to a Master Agreement ("CBA") governing the terms and conditions of employment for administrators who are employed by the District;

WHEREAS, Graham is employed by the District and covered by the aforementioned CBA;

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2019, the District voted to reduce Graham's position from a 1.0 FTE to a 0.5 FTE effective July 1, 2019, and placed Graham on a 0.5 FTE unrequested leave of absence for the 2019-2020 school year;

WHEREAS, Graham filed a grievance challenging the District's decision not to assign her to another 0.5 FTE position for the 2019-2020 school year, and ultimately, Graham filed an arbitration request in BMS Case No. 19-PA-1820;

WHEREAS, in the absence of this Agreement, the Parties would proceed to an arbitration hearing in front of Arbitrator Frank Kapsch; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement to settle the pending grievance in regard to whether the District was required to assign Graham another 0.5 FTE position under the CBA, allow Graham to resign, and allow the District to rehire Graham to work as the 0.5 FTE Assistant Special Services Director during the 2019-2020 school year under a return to work agreement with terms and conditions that differ from the negotiated terms and conditions of employment in the CBA.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF the mutual promises contained in this Agreement and other valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Grievance/Arbitration. Graham and the Union agree to voluntarily withdraw and dismiss the grievance and arbitration request referenced above, with prejudice, and to so notify the Arbitrator and BMS. The Union and Graham hereby knowingly and voluntarily waive any right they may have, either individually or collectively, to file a grievance or pursue any other action, challenge, or claim against the District regarding any aspect of this Agreement, the process used in the above-referenced grievance and arbitration, or the reduction in Graham's position.
- 2. Irrevocable Resignation and Unused Vacation Days. Graham hereby resigns from all employment with the District, effective September 16, 2019. Employee's resignation is voluntary, final, and irrevocable once this Agreement is signed by the parties. The Parties agree that Graham does not qualify for the Early Retirement Incentives outlined in Section 8 of the CBA, but that Graham will receive payment

- for her accrued and unused vacation day as of September 16, 2019, pursuant to Sections 2.1 and 2.5 of the CBA.
- **3. Rehire Term.** The term of Graham's probationary employment upon rehire shall begin on September 18, 2019, and end on June 30, 2020. During the term of this Agreement, the District may terminate Graham's probationary employment for cause, effective immediately, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes section 122A.40, subdivision 5. No accruals of any leave will carry over to the rehire period due to the break in service.
- **4. Employment.** Unless early termination occurs pursuant to Minnesota Statutes section 122A.40, subdivision 5, the District will employ Graham as a 0.5 FTE Assistant Special Services Director during the 2019-2020 school year. The position has exempt status under the Fair Labor Standards Act. As a result, additional hours worked beyond a forty-hour workweek will not result in overtime pay. Regular and prompt attendance is an essential function of the job.
- 5. Compensation and One-Time Payment. The Parties agree that Graham will receive an annual salary for the 2019-2020 school year of sixty-seven thousand, two hundred seventy dollars (\$67,270.00), commensurate with her 0.5 FTE position under the terms of the CBA. Payments made toward the 2019-2020 salary prior to September 18 shall be considered a part of this annual salary. In addition, Graham will receive a one-time payment of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00). The one-time payment shall be issued in two checks. One check shall be made to Corinne Graham in the amount of twenty-three thousand dollars (\$23,000), minus applicable payroll withholdings. The second check shall be made to Bassford Remele, P.A., in the amount of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000). Both checks shall be delivered within 20 days of execution of this Agreement to Graham's counsel, Daniel Olson, Bassford Remele, P.A., 100 South Fifth Street, Suite 1500, Minneapolis, MN 55402.
- 6. Benefits During Employment. During the 2019-2020 school year, the Parties agree that Graham shall be entitled to receive the benefits as outlined in the CBA for an administrator, including full health insurance benefits. The Parties agree that Graham has been hired as a 45 week employee, and that she will receive 16.5 non-duty days, 23.5 vacation days, 11 holidays, and 18 annual days for the 2019-2020 school year.
- 7. No Further Claim to Compensation or Benefits. This Agreement fully and completely satisfies all obligations between Graham, the District, and the Union that arise out of or relate to Graham's employment with the District during the 2019-2020 school year. Graham has no claim to any compensation, benefits, or payments of any nature whatsoever except as expressly stated in this Agreement.
- **8. No Continuing Contract Rights.** In accordance with *Thomas v. Independent School District No. 2142*, 639 N.W.2d 619 (Minn. App. 2002), the parties agree that Graham is in a probationary period of employment and that she does not have, and will not acquire, any continuing contract rights with the District during the 2019-2020 school

year. To the extent that any person asserts or may assert that Graham now has or will acquire a continuing contract during the 2019-2020 school year, Graham knowingly and voluntarily waives any and all real or purported rights under the Continuing Contract Law, Minnesota Statutes section 122A.40, including, but not limited to, any real or purported right to assert that she has a continuing contract, any real or purported right to bump into another position, and any real or purported right to assert that the District is obligated to reemploy her after the conclusion of the 2019-2020 school year.

- 9. Waiver of Right to File Grievance. Graham and the Union hereby waive any right they may have, either individually or collectively, to file a grievance, request a hearing, or pursue any other action against the District regarding the terms of this Agreement or any actions of the District prior to the signing of this Agreement, except that either the Union or Graham may file a grievance to enforce the terms of this Agreement.
- 10. No TRA Contributions. Graham has notified the District that she qualifies for full retirement benefits through the Teachers Retirement Association ("TRA") and that neither she nor the District is obligated to pay TRA a percentage of the wages she earns from the District while this Agreement is in effect. Accordingly, while this Agreement is in effect, the District will not pay a percentage of Graham's salary to TRA, and the District will not withhold or otherwise deduct the ordinary employee contribution from Graham's salary.
- 11. No Representations Regarding TRA or Other Retirement Benefits. The Parties acknowledge that Graham is solely responsible for determining the impact, if any, that this Agreement and her employment will have on her TRA benefits. The parties understand and agree that any issues regarding allowable service credit toward annuities and other benefits, or any other issues relating to any benefits that Graham may expect to receive from TRA, are strictly between Graham and TRA. Although this Agreement is intended to serve as a return to work agreement under Minnesota Statutes section 354.444, the District makes no representations, promises, or guarantees regarding the application of TRA laws or the impact of this Agreement on Graham's eligibility for TRA benefits, the amount of retirement or other benefits that Graham may receive from TRA, or any rights Graham might have. The parties agree that the District is not responsible, and may not be held liable to Graham, for any issues related to TRA. Graham hereby releases, indemnifies, and holds the District harmless as to any disputes, claims, or any other matters arising out of or relating to TRA benefits or payments.
- 12. Release of Claims. The District has agreed to provide Graham with certain benefits and privileges that she would not otherwise be entitled to receive in the absence of this Agreement. In consideration for those benefits and privileges, and as an inducement for the District to enter into this Agreement, Graham hereby fully and completely releases, acquits, and forever discharges the District, its current and former School Board members, superintendents, officers, employees, agents,

representatives, insurers, attorneys, and other affiliates from any and all liability for any and all damages, actions, or claims – regardless of whether they are known or unknown, direct or indirect, asserted or unasserted – that arise out of or related to any action, decision, event, fact, or circumstance occurring before Graham signs this Agreement. Graham understands and agrees that by signing this Agreement she is waiving and releasing any and all claims, complaints, causes of action, and demands of any kind that are based on or arise under any federal or state law, including but not limited to the federal and state constitutions, or any federal or state statutes, regulation, rule, or common law.

- 13. Claims Not Waived. By signing this Agreement, Graham does not release or waive the following: (a) any rights or claims that are based on any events that occur after she signs this Agreement; (b) any right to institute legal action for the purpose of enforcing this Agreement; (c) any claims arising under the Workers' Compensation Act, although the District or its insurer may contest such claims; or (d) any right to file a charge with a governmental agency, including the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, although the District may contest such a charge and Graham agrees that she will not be able to recover any award of compensation, damages, or any other monies if she files a charge or complaint or has a charge or complaint filed on her behalf with any federal, state, or local government agency.
- 14. Acceptance Period. Graham has the right to review and consider this Agreement for a period of twenty-one (21) calendar days after receiving it. Graham is advised to seek the advice of legal counsel regarding this Agreement. If Graham signs this Agreement before twenty-one (21) calendar days have elapsed from the date on which she first received a copy of the Agreement to review, she will voluntarily be waiving her right to the twenty-one (21) day review period.
- 15. Revocation Under the ADEA. Graham recognizes that by signing this Agreement, she is waiving and releasing any claims that she might have under the Age Discrimination in Employment Act ("ADEA"). If Graham signs this Agreement, she will have seven (7) calendar days to revoke her waiver and release of any claims arising under the ADEA. Graham understands that this particular right of revocation applies only to claims arising under the ADEA. For a revocation of claims under the ADEA to be effective, it must be delivered to Dr. John Schultz, Superintendent, 5701 Normandale Road, Edina, MN 55424, either personally or by United States mail within the seven-day period. If delivered by mail, the revocation must be postmarked within the seven-day period, properly addressed to Dr. Schultz, and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- 16. Rescission under the MHRA. Graham recognizes that by signing this Agreement she is waiving and releasing any employment discrimination and retaliation claims that she might have under the Minnesota Human Rights Act ("MHRA"). Under the MHRA (Minnesota Statutes section 363A.31), Graham has the right to rescind her claims in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days after signing it. This right of rescission applies only to any claims arising under the MHRA. For a rescission of

claims arising under the MHRA to be effective, it must be delivered to Dr. John Schultz, Superintendent, 5701 Normandale Road, Edina, MN 55424, either personally or by United States mail within the fifteen-day period. If delivered by mail, the revocation must be postmarked within the fifteen-day period, properly addressed to Dr. Schultz, and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.

- 17. Effect of Rescission or Revocation. If Graham rescinds or revokes any part of the Release of All Claims contained in this Agreement, the remainder of the Release of Claims and all other provisions of this Agreement will continue to be in effect, but the District will have no obligation to make the one-time payment as described in Paragraph 2.
- 18. Data Practices Act and Reporting Requirements. Graham acknowledges and affirms that the District is bound by the provisions of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, as well as other applicable state and federal laws, related to the release or reporting of data regarding her employment with the District. The Parties agree that the District will follow all state and federal laws regarding the classification and/or reporting of data.
- 19. Costs. Each Party shall be responsible for its own costs relating to the grievance and arbitration. The Union shall not be responsible for any costs or fees incurred.
- **20. Voluntary Agreement.** Graham acknowledges and agrees that no person has exerted any pressure on her or attempted to unduly influence her to sign this Agreement or to waive any rights. Graham is voluntarily choosing to enter into this Agreement because of the benefits it provides.
- 21. No Precedent or Past Practice. This Agreement does not set a precedent or past practice. Neither this Agreement nor the terms of this Agreement shall be offered by any party in an arbitration pursuant to the grievance procedure contained in the CBA, except for the purpose of enforcing this Agreement.
- **Equal Drafting.** In the event any party asserts that a provision of this Agreement is ambiguous, this Agreement will be construed to have been drafted equally by the Parties.
- **23. Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the aforementioned grievance. No party has relied upon any statements or promises that are not set forth in this Agreement. No changes to this Agreement are valid unless they are in writing and signed by both Parties.

By signing this Agreement the undersigned acknowledge and admit that they have read the Agreement, that they understand and agree to the terms, conditions, and implications of this Agreement, that they have been represented by legal counsel and that they have had a full and complete opportunity to obtain such advice as they deem necessary with respect to the settlement

of the Grievance. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, and a copy of this Agreement will have the same legal effect as the original.

# Payment Agreement and Release of Claims

This Payment Agreement and Release of Claims ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Debra Williams ("Employee"), EPASS (Edina Professional Association of Support Staff) ("The UNION"), and Independent School District No. 273, Edina ("the District").

WHEREAS, the Union and the District are Parties to a Master Agreement governing the terms and conditions of employment for employees within the bargaining unit;

WHEREAS, Employee is employed by the District in a 0.75 FTE position and covered by the aforementioned Master Agreement;

WHEREAS, the District recently learned that for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years, Employee worked the equivalent of a 1.0 FTE position while only being paid for the 0.75 FTE position for which she was authorized to work;

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into this Agreement to compensate Employee for the additional time worked during the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years, and to ensure that no future claims arise related to Employee's compensation for those school years.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF the mutual promises contained in this Agreement and other valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Compensation and One-Time Payment. The District agrees to pay Employee a one-time payment of five thousand (of \$17,525.00) in the August 30<sup>th</sup> payroll and the remaining balance of twelve thousand, five hundred twenty-five dollar (\$12,525.00), minus applicable withholdings, which shall be spread out and paid over the course of the remaining regular payroll cycles for the 2019-2020 school year.
- 2. No Further Claim to Compensation. This Agreement fully and completely satisfies any and all obligations between Employee and the District that arise out of or relate to her employment prior to the signing of this Agreement, and Employee shall have no claim to any compensation, overtime payments, benefits, or payments of any nature allegedly earned prior to the signing of this Agreement whatsoever, except as expressly stated in this Agreement.
- 3. Position. Employee is employed by the District in a 0.75 FTE position, and as such, shall only work the number of hours commensurate with this position moving forward. The District agrees to forego any discipline against the Employee for working unauthorized hours during the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 school years.
- 4. Release of Claims. The District has agreed to provide Employee with certain benefits and privileges that she would not otherwise be entitled to receive in the absence of this Agreement. If Employee rescinds or revokes any part of the Release of All Claims contained in this Agreement, the District will have no obligation to make the one-time payment as described in Paragraph 1. The remainder of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
- 10. Waiver of Right to File Grievance. Employee and the Union hereby waive any right they may have, either individually or collectively, to file a grievance or pursue any other claim or action against the District pursuant to the present or any future collective bargaining agreement between the District and the Union regarding the matters discussed in this Agreement and/or Employee's compensation prior to the signing of this Agreement.
- 11. No Precedent or Past Practice. This Agreement does not set a precedent or past practice. Neither this Agreement nor the terms of this Agreement shall be offered by any party in an arbitration pursuant to the grievance procedure contained in the Master Agreement, except for the purpose of enforcing this Agreement.
- 12. No Admission of Wrongdoing. This Agreement is made to settle disputed claims and may not be considered or presented as an admission of liability or wrongdoing by or on behalf of any Party. Employee acknowledges and affirms that the District has treated her fairly in all respects, and that any statement to the contrary would be false. The Parties similarly agree and affirm that any failure to pay wages owed was not intentional, and was instead based on a lack of knowledge, and that no District employee had any intent to defraud or otherwise withhold these payments. Employee acknowledges that any statement to the contrary would be false.
- 13. Data Practices Act and Reporting Requirements. Employee acknowledges and affirms that the District is bound by the provisions of the Minnesota Government Data Práctices Act, as well as other applicable state and federal laws, related to the release or reporting of data regarding her employment with the District. The Parties agree that the District will follow all state and federal laws regarding the classification and/or reporting of data.
- 14. Voluntary Agreement. Employee acknowledges and agrees that no person has exerted any pressure on her or attempted to unduly influence her to sign this Agreement or to waive any rights. Employee is voluntarily choosing to enter into this Agreement because of the benefits it provides.

- 15. Equal Drafting. In the event any party asserts that a provision of this Agreement is ambiguous, this Agreement will be construed to have been drafted equally by the Parties.
- 16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the aforementioned grievance. No party has relied upon any statements or promises that are not set forth in this Agreement. No changes to this Agreement are valid unless they are in writing and signed by both Parties.

By signing this Agreement the undersigned acknowledge and admit that they have read the Agreement, that they understand and agree to the terms, conditions, and implications of this Agreement, that they have been represented by legal counsel and that they have had a full and complete opportunity to obtain such advice as they deem necessary with respect to the settlement of the Grievance. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, and a copy of this Agreement will have the same legal effect as the original.

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### RESIGNATION AGREEMENT AND RELEASE OF CLAIMS

This Resignation Agreement and Release of Claims ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Nicole Stegner ("Employee") and Independent School District No. 273, Edina Public Schools ("District").

WHEREAS, the District currently employs Employee in the role of an at-will job of Payroll Supervisor; and

WHEREAS, Employee and the District desire to conclude their employment relationship in an amicable and mutually agreeable manner, and to ensure that no potential claims or conflicts arise.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, including the relinquishment of certain legal rights, the parties now agree as follows:

- 1. **Irrevocable Resignation.** Employee hereby resigns from all employment with the District, effective August 29, 2019. Employee's resignation is voluntary, final, and irrevocable once this Agreement is signed by the parties.
- 2. Compensation. As a severance package and inducement to enter into this Agreement, the District agrees to pay Employee her full monthly salary pursuant to her current contract, less applicable withholdings and deductions, through September 30, 2019, pursuant to the District's normal payroll cycles. The District will continue to pay insurance contributions and benefits through September 2019, with coverage ending effective at the end of the day on September 30, 2019. The District's obligation to make the payments outlined in this Paragraph will be null and void if Employee revokes or rescinds any part of the release of claims set forth in this Agreement. The District further agrees to pay Employee for 54.97667 hours of accrued vacation, based on Employee's daily rate of pay.
- 3. **No Further Claim to Compensation.** This Agreement completely satisfies any and all obligations between the parties that arise out of or relate to Employee's employment with the District and her resignation. Employee shall have no claim whatsoever to any compensation, employment benefits, or payments of any nature except as expressly stated in this Agreement. Employee hereby waives and relinquishes any and all rights to any compensation, payments, or employment benefits that are not specifically described in this Agreement.

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4. **Release of Claims.** The District has agreed to provide Employee with certain benefits and privileges that she would not otherwise be entitled to receive in the absence of this Agreement. In consideration for those benefits and privileges, and as an inducement for the District to enter into this Agreement, Employee hereby fully and completely releases, acquits, and forever discharges the District, its current and former Board members, officers, employees, agents, representatives, insurers, attorneys, and other affiliates from any and all liability for any and all damages, actions, or claims—regardless of whether they are known or unknown, direct or indirect, asserted or unasserted—that arise out of or relate to any action, decision, event, fact, or circumstance occurring before Employee signs this Agreement. Employee understands and agrees that by signing this Agreement, she is waiving and releasing any and all claims, complaints, causes of action, and demands of any kind that are based on or arise under any federal or state law, including but not limited to the federal, the state constitution, or any federal or state statute, regulation, rule, or common law.

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- 5. Claims Not Waived. By signing this Agreement, Employee does not release or waive the following: (a) any rights or claims that are based on any events that occur after she signs this Agreement; (b) any right to institute legal action for the purpose of enforcing this Agreement; (c) any right to apply for unemployment compensation benefits, although the District may contest such an application; (d) any claims arising under the Workers' Compensation Act, although the District or its insurer may contest such claims; or (e) any right to file a charge with a governmental agency, including the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, although the District may contest such a charge and Employee agrees that she will not be able to recover any award of compensation, damages, or any other monies if she files a charge or complaint or has a charge or complaint filed on her behalf with any federal, state, or local government agency.
- 6. Acceptance Period. Employee has the right to review and consider this Agreement for a period of twenty-one (21) calendar days after receiving it. Employee is advised to seek the advice of legal counsel regarding this Agreement. If Employee signs this Agreement before twenty-one (21) days have elapsed from the date on which she first received a copy of the Agreement to review, she will be voluntarily waiving her right to the twenty-one (21) day review period.
- 7. **Revocation Under the ADEA.** Employee recognizes that by signing this Agreement, she is waiving and releasing any employment discrimination, retaliation, or other claims that she might have under the Age Discrimination in Employment Act

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("ADEA"). After Employee signs this Agreement, she will have seven (7) calendar days to revoke her waiver and release of any claims arising under the ADEA. This right of revocation applies only to claims arising under the ADEA. For a revocation of claims under the ADEA to be effective, it must be delivered to Dr. Bryan Bass, 5701 Normandale Road, Edina, MN 55424, either personally or by United States mail within the seven-day period. If delivered by mail, the revocation must be postmarked within the seven-day period, properly addressed to Dr. Bass, and sent by certified mail, return

receipt requested.

- 8. Rescission Under the MHRA. Employee recognizes that by signing this Agreement, she is waiving and releasing any employment discrimination and retaliation claims that she might have under the Minnesota Human Rights Act ("MHRA"). Under the MHRA (Minnesota Statutes section 363A.31), Employee has the right to rescind her release of claims in writing within fifteen (15) calendar days after signing it. This right of rescission applies only to any claims arising under the MHRA. For a rescission of claims arising under the MHRA to be effective, it must be delivered to Dr. Bryan Bass, 5701 Normandale Road, Edina, MN 55424, either personally or by United States mail within the fifteen-day period. If delivered by mail, the rescission must be postmarked within the fifteen-day period, properly addressed to Dr. Bass, and sent by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- 9. **Effect of Rescission.** If Employee revokes or rescinds any part of the Release of All Claims in this Agreement, Paragraph 2 of this Agreement will be null and void and Employee shall have no right to receive any severance payments or benefits. The parties agree that the District will have no duty to compensate Employee beyond that date. The remainder of this Agreement and the Release of Claims will remain in full force and effect.
- 10. **Return of District Property.** Employee must return any and all District property that may be in her possession including, but not limited to, any and all keys, access cards, access codes, computers, laptops, cell phones, software, documents, reports, records, electronic data, data in any other form, and any other physical or personal property of the District.
- 11. **Private Data.** Employee acknowledges that in the course of her employment with the District, she has had access to data that are classified as confidential or private under federal or state law. Employee may not disclose or otherwise make such data available to

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any third person, unless she is specifically authorized to do so by Court order, by lawfully issued subpoena, or in writing by the District's Superintendent.

- 12. **Voluntary Agreement.** The parties acknowledge that no person has exerted undue pressure on them to sign this Agreement. Each party is voluntarily choosing to enter into this Agreement because of the benefits that are provided under this Agreement.
- 13. **No Wrongdoing.** This Agreement is made to ensure a clean separation of employment and is not to be considered an admission of liability or wrongdoing by or on behalf of any party or any person identified in interest with a party to this Agreement.
- 14. **Responsibility for Costs.** Each party is responsible for its own costs, expenses, and any attorney fees associated with this Agreement.
- 15. Choice of Law, Forum and Severability. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota regardless of Employee's domicile or status as a resident of Minnesota or any other state. The parties agree that the Minnesota state and federal courts will have exclusive jurisdiction over any dispute arising out of this Agreement. If a court determines that any part of this Agreement is unlawful or unenforceable, the remaining portions of the Agreement will remain in full force and effect.
- 16. **Equal Drafting.** In the event any party asserts that a provision of this Agreement is ambiguous, the Agreement must be construed to have been drafted equally by the parties.
- 17. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to Employee's employment with the District. This Agreement supersedes any inconsistent provisions in any other document, including, but not limited to, any applicable District policies, and any handbook provisions covering Employee's employment. No party has relied upon any statements, promises, or representations that are not stated in this document. No changes to this Agreement are valid unless they are in writing and signed by all parties. This Agreement may be signed in counterparts, and a copy of this Agreement will have the same legal effect as the original.

**BACKGROUND:** This is a revised contract with Fraser for site-based mental health clinics in elementary and early childhood school buildings as well as high school and middle schools to improve student access to mental health services during the school day. These services will result in an expansion of the District's Mental Health and Wellness service continuum to effectively service the needs of all students with Edina Public Schools.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the attached revised contract with Fraser for 2019-20 school year.

This Agreement for the location of a site-based mental health clinic in school buildings ("Agreement") is made and entered into August 1, 2019 by and between Independent School District No. 273, Edina Public Schools ("District") and Fraser ("Provider"). The District and the Provider are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties," and individually as a "Party."

WHEREAS, the District owns and operates Edina High School, Valley View Middle School, South View Middle School, Countryside Elementary School, Creek Valley Elementary School, Highlands Elementary School, Cornelia Elementary School, Concord Elementary School, Normandale Elementary School and Early Childhood Special Education ("Schools");

WHEREAS, Provider offers certain mental health therapy and treatment services to children, including children residing in and attending schools located within the District;

WHEREAS, Provider wishes to operate a site-based mental health clinic for children between the ages of Birth to 21 years of age;

WHEREAS, Provider wishes to operate the Program at the School; and

WHEREAS, the District desires to make space in the School available to Provider in order to facilitate Provider's access to children attending the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF the foregoing, the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, including the relinquishment of certain legal rights, and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency and receipt are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

## I. ACCESS TO DISTRICT PROPERTY AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DISTRICT

- A. Facility Use. The District shall designate one or more rooms in the School for use by the Provider in operating the Program ("Program Site"). Except as expressly provided herein, the number and location of the rooms of the Program Site shall be solely a matter of District discretion.
- B. Hours of Access. The Program Site will be accessible by the Provider and its employees, agents, and representatives during the normal business hours of the School. In the event that the Provider or any of its employees, agents, or representatives requires access to the Program Site when the School is not open, the Provider may contact the building Principal or Site Coordinator to make arrangements to allow the Provider to access the Program Site.
- C. Furnishing Provided by the District. The District shall furnish each room of the Program Site with a desk, one or more chairs, and a table. In addition, the District

will make available the use of a copy and fax machine as well as a dedicated phone for Provider's use. The Program Site shall be private and limited external noise for the purpose of therapy services and provided with electricity and access to the Internet, lighted, and climate controlled in the same manner as the other rooms of the School.

- D. Furnishing Provided by the Provider. Other than the items described in Paragraph III(C) of this Agreement, the Provider shall be responsible for furnishing the Program Site with all pieces of furniture, supplies, and/or other equipment, including computer equipment, that it deems necessary or desirable.
- G. Payment for Services Provided. Within thirty (30) calendar days after receiving the required invoice for consultative and therapeutic services, the District will pay Provider at the rate of 154 dollars (\$154,00) per hour for each hour of service under this Contract, including any time spent attending Individualized Education Plan (IEP) meetings at the request of the District. District agrees to pay for one (1) hour of consultative time for each of the ten (10) school sites each week (total of 10 hours per week) during weeks the school is open from September 2019 through May 2020, not to exceed 36 weeks total. In addition, District will pay for up to 10 hours of therapeutic services for each identified "Under Insured" or "Uninsured" student who has prior authorization from the District.

District will also provide 20,000 dollars (\$20,000.00), payable in four equal amounts of 5,000 dollars (\$5,000.00) in September, November, January and March to support startup of one additional Fraser clinician at Edina High School.

The total cost of the services to the District shall not exceed \$154.00 per hour plus the startup fee of \$20,000.00. The District will not pay or reimburse Provider for any mileage costs or other expenses incurred by Provider. If early termination occurs under any provision of this Contract, the District's obligation to make payments will cease effective upon the last date that Provider delivers services.

The District will submit Contract costs for special education services to the Minnesota Department of Education for reimbursement in accordance with the Department's special education procedures. Local District funds will be used to co-fund the services as necessary.

#### II. PROVIDER'S OBLIGATIONS

- A. Access to Mental Health Services. The Provider acknowledges and agrees that Edina district students, who are in need of mental health services offered as part of the Program are able to participate in the Program or receive other mental health services from Provider.
  - Consultation Services. One hour of consultative services shall be provided weekly, during the school year, by the Provider to each school site. The purpose of these services is to work with building problemsolving teams in

- 2. Services to Under Insured and Uninsured Students. Students identified by the District as "Under Insured" or "Uninsured" will have access to mental health services by the Provider at the District's expense. The prior authorization of these services is required. A formal process of identification and prior authorization will be developed by the District. Prior authorization will allow for up to ten therapeutic sessions. Additional sessions may be requested by the provider. No unauthorized services will be reimbursed with the sole exception that the services were required due to an unforeseen emergency or crisis.
- B. Criminal Background Check. Consistent with Minnesota Statutes section 123B.03, subdivision I(c), the Provider must conduct a criminal background check on every individual who has access to the Program Site. The background check must be completed before the individual has access to the Program Site. Copies of the criminal background check must be made available to the District upon request.
- C. Insurance. At its own expense, the Provider shall maintain general liability insurance for its operations throughout the term of this Agreement. Such insurance shall be in amounts not less than the limits set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 466.04, as amended. The District shall be named as an additional insured on Provider's policy of liability insurance. Within ten (10) business days after receiving a fully executed copy of this Agreement, the Provider shall provide the District with proof of such insurance.

#### III. LIABILITY

- A. Indemnification. The Provider hereby agrees to defend and indemnify the District, its board members, employees, agents, and representatives against any and all claims, demands, actions, administrative proceedings, causes of action, and liability, of any nature arising out of or relating to this Agreement. This indemnification specifically includes, but is not limited to, any action arising out of any allegation of the following: failure to comply with any federal or state law; or any form of inappropriate conduct by the Provider. Upon timely written notice from the District, the Provider shall defend the District in any such action or proceeding within the purview of this Paragraph brought against the District, its employees, officers, directors, attorneys, and agents.
- B. Limitation on Indemnification. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require the Provider to indemnify, defend, save or hold harmless the District, its employees, officers, directors, and agents against any claims, demands, suits, costs, judgments or other forms of liability, actual or claimed, including attorneys' fees, for any injury resulting from the intentional or negligent misconduct of the District, its employees, officers, directors, oragents.

- C. Restriction on Settlement. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, the Provider shall not settle or compromise any claim against the District without a signed agreement approved by the District.
- D. Effect of Termination. The Parties agree and acknowledge that the Provider's duty to defend and indemnify the District survives the termination and/or expiration of this Agreement.

#### IV. DATAPRIVACY

- An Governing Law. The Parties understand and agree that all documents, surveillance tapes, and other recorded information created, received, and/or maintained by the District are "government data" within the meaning of the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act ("MGDPA") and that student records are also governed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"). The Parties further understand and agree that the MGDPA and FERPA limit the District's ability to release such data or records. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to provide the Provider or any of its employees, agents, independent contractors, volunteers, or other representatives with access to any data, document, surveillance tape, or other recorded information beyond that which is provided by the MGPDA and/or FERPA.
- B. District Access to Student Records. If any District student is enrolled in the Program or otherwise receives services from the Provider as part of the student's educational program, the Provider agrees that, as part of its intake process, it will strongly encourage the student's parent or guardian to sign a written and legally sufficient authorization to allow the District and the Provider to consult regularly on the student's progress and treatment in order to improve educational outcomes and therapeutic programming.

#### V. DURATION AND TERMINATION

- A. Expiration. This Agreement expires at 11:59 p.m. on July 31, 2020. This Agreement shall not automatically renew or continue. The Parties may only renew or continue this Agreement in writing, signed by both Parties.
- B. Termination With or Without Cause. This Agreement may be terminated, with or without cause, by either Party upon thirty (30) days' notice in writing to the other Party.
- C. Termination for Cause. The District may terminate this Agreement, for cause, if the Provider fails to perform any obligation required by this Agreement, including, but not limited to, administering appropriate background checks on any employee or volunteer accessing the Program Site, as required by this Agreement.
- D. Effect of Expiration or Termination. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, all obligations, rights, duties, and entitlements created by this Agreement terminate and are extinguished, without need of any further action by

### VI. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY, NONDISCRIMINATION AND CIVIL RIGHTS

The Provider agrees to provide equal opportunity to all employees and applicants for employment in accordance with applicable EEO/AA laws, directives and regulations of Federal, State and local governing bodies or agencies thereof, specifically Minnesota Statutes Chapter 363A.

No persons shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, age, sex, disability, marital status, sexual preference, HIV status, public assistance status, creed or national origin be excluded from full employment rights in, participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program, service, or activity under the provisions of any or all applicable Federal and State laws, including the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

#### VII. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Choice of Law and Severability. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota, without regard to its conflicts of laws provisions. If a court of competent jurisdiction determines that any part of this Agreement is void or voidable, violates any law, or is otherwise unenforceable, the remaining portions of this Agreement will remain in full force and effect, unless the remaining portions would not serve the original purpose of this Agreement:
- B. Joint Drafting. This Agreement must be construed to have been drafted equally by the Parties.
- C. Responsibility for Costs. With the exception of the costs assumed by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement, each Party shall be responsible for its own costs, expenses, and any attorneys' fees associated with this Agreement and any related matters, including enforcement of this Agreement.
- D. Enforcement. Failure to insist on compliance with any term, covenant, or condition contained in this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of that term, covenant, or condition, nor shall any waiver or relinquishment of any right or power contained in this Agreement at any time be deemed a waiver or relinquishment of any right or power at any other time.
- E. Voluntary Agreement. All Parties have voluntarily signed this Agreement. No Party has been threatened, coerced, intimidated, or otherwise forced to sign this agreement by any other Party, any officer, employee, School Board member, agent, representative, or attorney of any other Party, or any other person or entity acting on behalf of any other Party.

- F. Relationship of the Parties. The Provider does not operate any site-based mental health facilities on behalf of the District. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create any partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the Provider, and/or its employees, officers, directors, and/or agents, and the District and/or its employees, officers, directors, and/or agents. The Parties understand and agree that this Agreement does not create any rights or obligations beyond those expressly contained herein.
- G. Complete Agreement. This Agreement, along with the Business Associate Agreement, constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties relating to the matters addressed in this document. This Agreement supersedes any and all prior agreements between the Parties. No Party has relied upon any statements, promises or representations other than those contained in this Agreement. No changes to this Agreement shall be considered valid unless they are in writing and signed by both Parties.

By signing below, each Party specifically acknowledges that it has read this Agreement, that it has had an opportunity to review this Agreement with legal counsel, that it understands this Agreement, and that it agrees to be legally bound by all terms of this Agreement.

#### Agreement for Providing Chemical Health Support at a School Site

Independent School District No. 273, Edina Public Schools, hereafter referred to as the DISTRICT, and Relate Counseling Center, hereafter referred to as the CONTRACTOR, agree to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Services to be performed by the CONTRACTOR: CONTRACTOR will provide chemical health support services by a Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor ("LADC") at Edina High-South View and Valley View Middle Schools in the DISTRICT. These services include, but are not limited to, chemical health counseling, support groups, and staff professional development.
- 2. **Schedule of Services and Payment:** The CONTRACTOR will comply with the following schedule in the performance of services:
  - a. The annual term ("TERM") of this Agreement shall be September 1 to June 30 of the following year.
  - b. The total amount due the CONTRACTOR from the DISTRICT for the above stated services shall be \$28,800.00 per TERM.
  - c. The CONTRACTOR may invoice monthly and shall at minimum invoice quarterly. The DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR within 30 days of receipt of an invoice from the CONTRACTOR.
  - d. The contract may be terminated by the DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR at any time, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.
  - e. Termination for Cause. Either party may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause based on a material breach of the terms of this Agreement. Among other reasons, the DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement immediately for cause if any of the following events occur:
    - Failure to Perform Background Checks. CONTRACTOR fails to perform any background check on any employee or volunteer working with or providing Services to students in accordance with this Agreement;
    - 2. Failure to Provide Necessary Information. CONTRACTOR fails to provide the DISTRICT with any documentation and/or information required by this Agreement (a "Default"), and CONTRACTOR does not cure the Default within five (5) school days after receiving written notice of such Default from the DISTRICT, or within such other time period as the DISTRICT agrees, in writing, to provide CONTRACTOR in which to cure the Default;
    - 3. Breach of Data Privacy. CONTRACTOR fails to comply with the data privacy provisions set forth in this Agreement.
  - f. Effect of Expiration or Termination. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, all obligations, rights, duties, and entitlements created by

this Agreement terminate and are extinguished, without need of any further action by either Party, upon the effective date of termination or expiration of this Agreement.

- 3. **Contractor Certifications:** The undersigned CONTRACTOR certifies:
  - a. CONTRACTOR is not an employee of the DISTRICT and the DISTRICT is not its employer. The CONTRACTOR thereby waives any and all claims to benefits otherwise provided to employees, including but not limited to medical, dental or other personal insurance; retirement benefits; unemployment benefits; and workers' compensation insurance coverage, if not required by law.
  - b. The services provided by the CONTRACTOR are not supervised or controlled by the DISTRICT, and the only demand on the CONTRACTOR'S time is faithful performance and delivery of described services by the specific deadline.
  - c. If the CONTRACTOR will be performing services with the help of others, CONTRACTOR certifies that it is in compliance with Minn. Stat. 176.181, subd. 2, pertaining to workers' compensation insurance coverage and will file with this form a certificate of workers' compensation.
  - d. CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any person referred for CONTRACTOR services because of race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, age, national origin, ethnicity or socioeconomic status.
  - e. CONTRACTOR agrees to provide equal opportunity to all employees and applicants for employment in accordance with all applicable laws, directives and rules and/or regulations of Federal, State and local governing bodies or agencies. CONTRACTOR specifically agrees to comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Minnesota Human Rights Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 363A, as amended.

#### 4. Data Privacy

- a. Governing Laws. All data collected, received, maintained or disseminated for any purpose in the course of CONTRACTOR'S performance of this Agreement is governed by the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act ("MGDPA"), Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, and any other applicable Minnesota statutes and Minnesota rules, as well as Federal statutes and regulations related to data privacy. The Parties agree that this Agreement does not alter in any manner or degree a student's right of privacy in educational records generated by the DISTRICT.
- Release Required. The data created, gathered, or maintained by CONTRACTOR is subject to the requirements of the MGDPA.
   CONTRACTOR and the DISTRICT will not provide the other with information arising out of their respective relationships with the students and their parents or legal guardians, except pursuant to written and legally sufficient authorization by a student and the student's parent or legal guardian.

c. If CONTRACTOR has access to students' educational records,
CONTRACTOR shall limit the access to such records to those persons who
have a legitimate need to access the information in order to provide
services in accordance with this contract. Any access to medical records
of any student shall comply with the Health Insurance Portability and
Accountability Act ("HIPAA").

#### 5. Indemnification

- a. CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, save, and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its employees, officers, directors, attorneys, and agents against any and all claims, demands, suits, costs, judgments, or other forms of liability, actual or claimed, including attorneys' fees and punitive damages, for injury to property or persons, arising out of any intentional and/or negligent actions or omissions by the CONTRACTOR, its employees, officers, directors, volunteers, agents, or independent contractors, or actions or omissions of third parties under the CONTRACTOR'S control and supervision, in connection with any Services provided by CONTRACTOR during the term of this Agreement. Upon timely written notice from the DISTRICT, CONTRACTOR shall defend the DISTRICT in any such action or proceeding within the purview of this Paragraph brought against the DISTRICT, its employees, officers, directors, attorneys, and agents.
- b. Limitation on Indemnification. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require CONTRACTOR to indemnify, defend, save or hold harmless the DISTRICT, its employees, officers, directors, and agents against any claims, demands, suits, costs, judgments or other forms of liability, actual or claimed, including attorneys' fees, for any injury resulting from the intentional or gross negligence of the DISTRICT, its employees, officers, directors, or agents.
- Restriction on Settlement. Notwithstanding any other provision in this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall not settle or compromise any claim against the DISTRICT without a signed agreement approved by the DISTRICT.
- d. **Effect of Termination.** The Parties agree and acknowledge that the CONTRACTOR's duty to defend and indemnify the DISTRICT survives the termination and/or expiration of this Agreement.

#### 6. District Responsibilities

- a. The DISTRICT agrees to allow CONTRACTOR access to a space it has selected (hereinafter referred to as "Appointment Room") in a school site for the purposes and under the circumstances described herein and subject to the limitations set forth herein. The DISTRICT reserves the right to change the location of the Appointment Room as circumstances require.
- b. During periods scheduled for an appointment by CONTRACTOR, the DISTRICT will make reasonable efforts to assure uninterrupted use of the

Appointment Room by CONTRACTOR and a student. CONTRACTOR may post a "Do Not Disturb" sign on the door to the Appointment Room when it is being used pursuant to this Agreement. The Appointment Room may be used by CONTRACTOR solely for the purpose of conducting appointments CONTRACTOR has scheduled with DISTRICT students. No other use, legal or illegal, shall be permitted. No files relating to or arising out of the professional relationship between the CONTRACTOR and a student or the student's family shall be stored or maintained on the premises of the school site, including within the Appointment Room. CONTRACTOR may utilize desks, chairs, white boards and other equipment located in the room during scheduled appointments but shall restore such equipment to its pre-appointment condition and location at the end of the appointment.

c. Meetings between CONTRACTOR staff members providing the services pursuant to this Agreement and students of the DISTRICT shall be scheduled so as to minimize disruption to the student's daily routine and to the orderly functioning of the DISTRICT.

#### 7. Contractor Insurance Requirements:

- a. CONTRACTOR shall obtain and maintain throughout the term of this Agreement general liability insurance in the minimum amount required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 466.04, as amended, covering all of the CONTRACTOR'S activities related to this Agreement.
- b. CONTRACTOR shall obtain and maintain throughout the term of this Agreementprofessional liability insurance covering acts, errors, mistakes, and omissions arising out of the work or services performed by the CONTRACTOR, in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.
- c. A certificate of insurance will be provided to the DISTRICT upon request.

#### 8. Contractor's Responsibilities:

- a. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with Minnesota Statutes Section 123B.03 concerning conducting criminal background checks through the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension. CONTRACTOR agrees to assume all expenses associated with these background checks.
- b. CONTRACTOR shall provide evidence that each of its employees, volunteers and agents assigned at the DISTRICT are appropriately experienced, trained, qualified and appropriately licensed to perform any service or task assigned to the employee by the CONTRACTOR. CONTRACTOR agrees that all of its agents that may come into contact with students serviced under this Agreement must undergo background checks consistent with #8A above and copies of the background checks will be provided to the DISTRICT upon request without charge. The CONTRACTOR will advise the DISTRICT, in writing, of any event or circumstance adversely affecting the qualification or licensure of any agent to provide services to students at the DISTRICT.

- c. CONTRACTOR acknowledges and agrees that it and its personnel will comply with the DISTRICT policies and workplace expectations.
- d. CONTRACTOR is hereby notified and agrees to assume full responsibility for notifying all of its employees of the remote possibility that they may be at risk in certain instances for exposure to a bloodborne pathogen such as the Hepatitis B Virus and complying with all provisions of the OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Standards for its employees.
- e. CONTRACTOR agrees that it has sole responsibility for supervising and directing its personnel providing the services to the DISTRICT. Upon written notification that CONTRACTOR's personnel assigned at the DISTRICT have violated the DISTRICT policies or workplace expectations, or have disrupted the educational environment, CONTRACTOR will promptly substitute another employee.

#### 9. Miscellaneous:

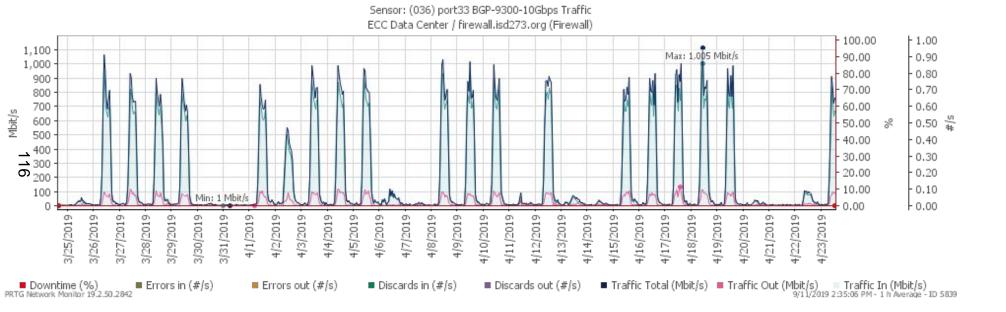

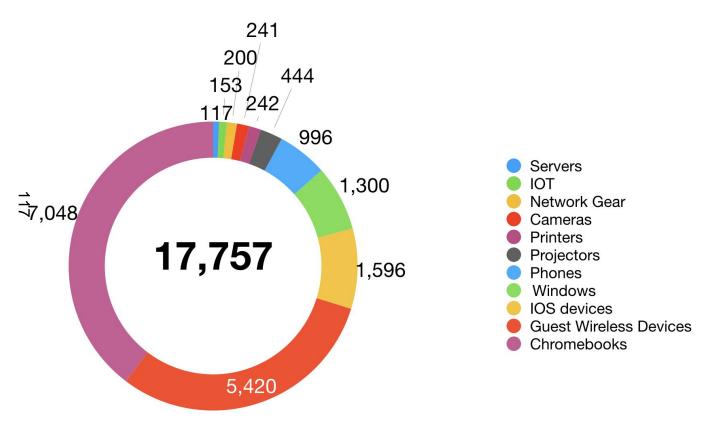

# **Education Programs**

## Selection and Objection of Instructional Text, Materials, Content or Issues

## I. Purpose

This policy provides direction for the selection of instructional text, materials and content. The policy also provides a procedure for addressing an objection to the text, materials, content or critical issues discussed in classrooms.

# II. General Statement of Policy

The school district recognizes that selection of textbooks and instructional materials is a vital support for the district's academic standards and curriculum. The school board has the authority to make final decisions on selection of instructional text, materials and content.

The academic standards and course outlines developed by the staff will serve as the basis for instructional text, materials and content selection. Professional staff will access libraries, online resources, instructional materials' centers, student support services, community resources and other appropriate resources in an effort to provide effective instruction for all students.

## III. Responsibility of Selection

- A. The school board retains the authority to make final decisions on the selection of instructional text, materials and content. The professional staff's expertise and involvement is vital to the recommendation of instructional text, materials and content. The director of teaching and learning will work directly with the staff in developing such recommendations.
- B. Based on the review of instructional text, materials and content during the selection process, the recommendations will:
  - 1. support the academic standards of the education programs;
  - 2. consider the needs, age, and maturity of students;
  - 3. foster respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and varied opinion;
  - 4. meet within the constraints of the school district budget;
  - be in the English language. Another language may be used, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 124D.61 or for reading materials assigned for a world language course; and

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- permit grade-level instruction for students to read and study America's founding documents, including documents that contributed to the foundation or maintenance of America's representative form of limited government, the Bill of Rights, our free-market economic system, and patriotism; and
- 5. not censor or restrain instruction in American or Minnesota state history or heritage based on religious references in original source documents, writings, speeches, proclamations, or records.
- C. The director of teaching and learning will be responsible for developing procedures and guidelines to establish an orderly process for the review and recommendation of textbooks and other instructional materials by the professional staff. Such procedures and guidelines will provide opportunity for input and consideration of the views of students, parents, and members of the district community. This procedure will be coordinated with the district's curriculum development effort and may utilize the World's Best Workforce.
- IV. Selection and Review of Instructional Text, Materials and Content
  - A. The director of teaching and learning will be responsible for keeping the school board informed of progress on the part of staff and others involved in the review and selection process.
  - B. The director of teaching and learning will present recommendations to the school board after completion of the review process as outlined in this policy.
  - C. Upon school board approval, the director of teaching and learning will be responsible for implementing the recommendations into the learning setting.
- V. Objection to Instructional Text and/or Materials
  - A. The school district will provide a process for district families and/or community members to object and seek reconsideration of select instructional text and/or materials.
  - B. The director of teaching and learning will be responsible for the development of guidelines and procedures to identify the steps to be followed to seek reconsideration of instructional text and/or materials.
- VI. Request for Review of Instructional Materials
  - A. Specific instructional content objections will be directed to the teacher. The teacher will:
    - 1. Treat each request with confidentiality.

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- 2. The teacher will work with the student and family to come to a resolution.
- If a resolution cannot be reached the teacher will explain the school district alternative instruction request process. Appendix I contains the process for Instructional Material Review Request.

### VII. Controversial Issues Discussed in Classroom

Controversial issues may be discussed in the classroom to advance student learning, and will be guided by Appendix IV of this policy.

# Appendix I to Policy 606

### INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL REVIEW PROCESS

This process is utilized when an objection to instructional material has been made and agreement with the teacher cannot be reached. An orderly process of instructional resource and supplemental materials review ensures an appropriate balance for those most concerned:

- The teachers who have the right to express their professional recommendations and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The students who have the right to express their preferences and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The parents and community who have the right to express their preferences and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials

## The process:

- 1. If an alternative curriculum agreement cannot be reached between the teacher, student and parent/guardian then the parent/guardian should submit a Request for Review of Materials form (Appendix II) to the building administrator.
- 2. The request should be reviewed by a building team. This team should be comprised of teachers, administrators, directors or other staff as applicable.
- 3. The team should review the initial request including the proposed solution for viability. The building team should ensure the proposed solution provides the best alternative possible for the student. The proposed solution will consider inclusion of the student(s) in the classroom while minimizing classroom disruption, and will seek to ensure a student is not removed from the classroom setting for an unreasonable amount of time without parental or guardian agreement.
  - a. The team should first use the table below to determine the degree to which the objectionable material meets the criteria.
  - b. In addition, the team should assess the proposed materials with the provided questions below. The questions below should be used not as a pass/fail tool, but as additional information for the decision making process

Does the material support the academic standards of the education programs?

Does the material consider the needs, age, and maturity of students?

Does the material foster respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and varied opinions?

Review the material to ensure it does not censor or restrain instruction in American or Minnesota state history or heritage based on religious references in original

source documents, writings, speeches, proclamations, or records.

Does the material falls within the constraints of the school district budget?

To what degree does the proposed material meet the criteria listed above?

- c. The team will use all available information to resolve the submitted objection. The resolution should be communicated to the person submitting the request and all relevant parties.
- 4. If a parent/guardian does not agree with the solution provided by the building team the request will be forwarded to the superintendent or designee. The decision of the superintendent or designee is final.

# Appendix IV to Policy 606 CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES

Controversial issues may be discussed in the classroom, provided that:

- The issue is related to the course of study or to relevant current events and provides opportunities for critical thinking, for developing tolerance, and for understanding conflicting points of view.
- 2. The issue has meaningful relationship to matters of concern to the students.
- 3. Available information about the issue is sufficient to allow alternative points of view to be discussed and evaluated on a factual basis.
- 4. All sides of the issue are given a proper hearing, using established facts as primary evidence.
- 5. The issue has points of view which can be understood and defined by the students.
- 6. The teacher does not use his/her position to forward his/her own religious, political, economic or social bias. The teacher may express a personal opinion if he/she identifies it as such and does not express the opinion for the purpose of persuading students to his/her point of view.
- 7. Discussion or study of the issue is instigated by the students, relevant current events, and, the established curriculum, but not by a source outside of the schools.
- 8. The discussion does not reflect adversely upon persons because of their race, sex, color, creed, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, handicap or occupation.
- 9. The oral or written presentation does not violate state or federal law.

The director of teaching and learning will have the authority to judge whether the above conditions are being met.

## I. Purpose

# II. General Statement of Policy

<u>T</u>+he school district recognizes that selection of textbooks and instructional materials is a vital support for the <u>school</u> district's academic standards and curriculum. The school board has the authority to make final decisions on selection of instructional text, materials and content.

The academic standards and course outlines developed by the staff shallwill serve as the basis for instructional text, materials and content selection. Professional staff shallwill access libraries, online resources, instructional materials' centers, student support services, community resources and other appropriate resources in an effort to provide effective instruction for all students.

## III. Responsibility of Selection

- A. The school board retains the authority to make final decisions on the selection of instructional text, materials and content. The professional staff's expertise and involvement is vital to the recommendation of instructional text, materials and content. The director of teaching and learning <a href="mailto:shallwill">shallwill</a> work directly with the staff in developing such recommendations.
- B. Based on the review of instructional text, materials and content during the selection process, the recommendations <a href="mailto:shallwill">shallwill</a>:
  - support the academic standards of the education programs;
  - 2. consider the needs, age, and maturity of students;
  - 3. foster respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and varied opinion;
  - 4. meet within the constraints of the school district budget;
  - 5. be in the English language. Another language may be used, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 124D.61 or for reading materials assigned for a world

## language course; and

- 6. permit grade-level instruction for students to read and study America's founding documents, including documents that contributed to the foundation or maintenance of America's representative form of limited government, the Bill of Rights, our free-market economic system, and patriotism; and
- <u>5</u>7. not censor or restrain instruction in American or Minnesota state history or heritage based on religious references in original source documents, writings, speeches, proclamations, or records.
- C. The director of teaching and learning <a href="shallwill">shallwill</a> be responsible for developing procedures and guidelines to establish an orderly process for the review and recommendation of textbooks and other instructional materials by the professional staff. Such procedures and guidelines <a href="shallwill">shallwill</a> provide opportunity for input and consideration of the views of students, parents, and members of the <a href="school">school</a> district community. This procedure <a href="shallwill">shallwill</a> be coordinated with the <a href="school">school</a> district's curriculum development effort and may utilize the <a href="Student Achievement CommitteeWorld">Student Achievement CommitteeWorld</a>'s <a href="Best Workforce">Best Workforce</a>.
- IV. Selection and Review of Instructional Text, Materials and Content
  - A. The director of teaching and learning shallwill be responsible for keeping the school board informed of progress on the part of staff and others involved in the review and selection process.
  - B. The director of teaching and learning shallwill present recommendations to the school board after completion of the review process as outlined in this policy.
  - C. Upon school board approval, the director of teaching and learning shallwill be responsible for implementing the recommendations into the learning setting.
- V. Objection to Instructional Text and/or Materials
  - A. The school district shallwill provide a process for district families and/or community members to object and seek reconsideration of select instructional text and/or materials.
  - B. The director of teaching and learning shallwill be responsible for the development of guidelines and procedures to identify the steps to be followed to seek reconsideration of instructional text and/or materials.
- VI. Objection to Instructional Content-Request for Review of Instructional Materials
  - A. Specific instructional content objections shallwill be directed to the building principal and/or director of teaching and learningteacher. The teacher school official will:

- 1. Treat each request with confidentiality.
- 2. The teacher will work with the student and family to come to a resolution.
- 3. If a resolution cannot be reached the teacher will Provide and explain the school district alternative instruction request process.
- 3. explain the school district alternative instruction request process. Appendix I contains the process for Instructional Material Review Request.
  The teacher will work with the student and family ...?
- B. Upon receipt of the alternative instruction request ... they will follow the steps outlined in the appendix....?:

The parent, guardian and/or adult student may submit an alternative instruction plan to the school official and certified staff (i.e. classroom teacher, department head and/or counselor). The school district will not pay for any alternative instruction costs.

- 2. All parties will review the plan.
- 1. The principal or designee will determine collaborate with the director of teaching and learning to determine whether the alternative instruction plan is essentially equivalent to that provided as part of the adopted curriculum. The school district may evaluate and assess the quality of the student's alternative instruction work for grading purposes.
- The principal or designee and director of teaching and learning will coordinate the delivery approach of the alternative instructional plan with the teacher. The delivery approach will consider inclusion of the student(s) in the classroom while minimizing classroom disruption. The delivery approach will seek to ensure a student is not removed from the classroom setting for an unreasonable amount of time.without parental or guardian agreement.
- hen the plan is approved, the principal or designee will work collaboratively with the Director of Teaching and Learning to identify an instructional delivery approach which seeks to ensure inclusion of the student(s) in the classroom while minimizing any classroom disruption caused by the plan.
- The decision of the principal or designee and director of teaching and learning related to the request is final.

### VII. Controversial Issues Discussed in Classroom

Controversial issues may be discussed in the classroom to advance student

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# learning, and will be guided by Appendix IV of this policy.

This process is utilized when an objection to instructional material has been made and agreement with the teacher cannot be reached. An orderly process of instructional resource and supplemental materials review einsures an appropriate balance for those most concerned:

- The teachers who have the right to express their professional <u>recommendations</u> desires and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The students who have the right to express their <u>preferences</u> and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The parents and community who have the right to express their <u>preferences</u> desires and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials

# The process has three steps:

- 1. If an alternative curriculum agreement cannot be reached between the teacher, student and parent/guardian then the parent/guardian should submit a 1.
   Evaluation of instructional materials according to specified criteria
- 2. Creation of a level of awareness among parents and community
- 3.1. Recommendation to school board for adoption of new instructional resources and materials Request for Review of Materials form (Appendix II) to the building administrator.
- 4.2. The request should be reviewed by a building team. This team should be comprised of teachers, administrators, directors or other staff as applicable.
- 5.3. The team should review the initial request including the proposed solution for viability. The building team should ensure the proposed solution provides the best alternative possible for the student. The proposed solution delivery approach will consider inclusion of the student(s) in the classroom while minimizing classroom disruption, and. The proposed delivery approach will seek to ensure a student is not removed from the classroom setting for an unreasonable amount of time-without parental or guardian agreement.
  - a. The team should first use the table below to determine the degree to which the objectionable material meets the criteria.

b. In addition, the team should assess the proposed materials with the provided questions below. The questions below should be used not as a pass/fail tool, but as additional information for the decision making process

Does the material support the academic standards of the education programs?

Does the material consider the needs, age, and maturity of students?

Does the material foster respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and varied opinions?

Review the material to ensure it does not censor or restrain instruction in American or Minnesota state history or heritage based on religious references in original source documents, writings, speeches, proclamations, or records.

<u>Does the material falls within the constraints of the school district budget?</u>

<u>To what degree does the proposed material meet the criteria listed above?</u>

- c. The team will use all available information to resolve the submitted objection.

  The resolution should be communicated to the person submitting the request and all relevant parties.
- 4. If a parent/guardian does not agree with the solution provided by the building team the request will be forwarded to the superintendent or designee. The decision of the superintendent or designee is final.

The amount of instructional material available makes it possible to offer alternatives to challenged or controversial material. Should students or parents have objections to any material, teachers shallwill offer substitute selections.

- 4. All sides of the issue are given a proper hearing, using established facts as primary evidence.
- 5. The issue has points of view which can be understood and defined by the students.
- 6. The teacher does not use his/her position to forward his/her own religious, political, economic or social bias. The teacher may express a personal opinion if he/she identifies it as such and does not express the opinion for the purpose of persuading students to his/her point of view.
- Discussion or study of the issue is instigated by the students, relevant current events, and, or the established curriculum, but not by a source outside of the schools.
- 8. The discussion does not reflect adversely upon persons because of their race, sex, color, creed, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, handicap or occupation.
- 9. The oral or written presentation does not violate state or federal law.

The <u>ddirector</u> of <u>tteaching</u> and <u>ltearning</u> shall <u>will</u> have the authority to judge whether the above conditions are being met.

#### **Education Programs**

#### **Selection and Objection of Instructional Text, Materials and Content**

#### I. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide direction for selection of instructional text, materials and content. The policy also provides a procedure for addressing an objection to the text, materials and/or content.

#### II. General Statement of Policy

The school district recognizes that selection of textbooks and instructional materials is a vital support for the school district's academic standards and curriculum. The school board has the authority to make final decisions on selection of instructional text, materials and content.

The academic standards and course outlines developed by the staff shall serve as the basis for instructional text, materials and content selection. Professional staff shall access libraries, online resources, instructional materials' centers, student support services, community resources and other appropriate resources in an effort to provide effective instruction for all students.

#### III. Responsibility of Selection

- A. The school board retains the authority to make final decisions on the selection of instructional text, materials and content. The professional staff's expertise and involvement is vital to the recommendation of instructional text, materials and content. The director of teaching and learning shall work directly with the staff in developing such recommendations.
- B. Based on the review of instructional text, materials and content during the selection process, the recommendations shall:
  - support the academic standards of the education programs;
  - 2. consider the needs, age, and maturity of students;
  - 3. foster respect and appreciation for cultural diversity and varied opinion;
  - 4. meet within the constraints of the school district budget;
  - 5. be in the English language. Another language may be used, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 124D.61;
  - 6. permit grade-level instruction for students to read and study America's

- founding documents, including documents that contributed to the foundation or maintenance of America's representative form of limited government, the Bill of Rights, our free-market economic system, and patriotism; and
- 7. not censor or restrain instruction in American or Minnesota state history or heritage based on religious references in original source documents, writings, speeches, proclamations, or records.
- C. The director of teaching and learning shall be responsible for developing procedures and guidelines to establish an orderly process for the review and recommendation of textbooks and other instructional materials by the professional staff. Such procedures and guidelines shall provide opportunity for input and consideration of the views of students, parents, and members of the school district community. This procedure shall be coordinated with the school district's curriculum development effort and may utilize the Student Achievement Committee.

#### IV. Selection and Review of Instructional Text, Materials and Content

- A. The director of teaching and learning shall be responsible for keeping the school board informed of progress on the part of staff and others involved in the review and selection process.
- B. The director of teaching and learning shall present recommendations to the school board after completion of the review process as outlined in this policy.
- C. Upon school board approval, the director of teaching and learning shall be responsible for implementing the recommendations into the learning setting.

#### V. Objection to Instructional Text and/or Materials

- A. The school district shall provide a process for district families and/or community members to object and seek reconsideration of select instructional text and/or materials.
- B. The director of teaching and learning shall be responsible for the development of guidelines and procedures to identify the steps to be followed to seek reconsideration instructional text and/or materials.

#### VI. Objection to Instructional Content

- A. Specific instructional content objections shall be directed to the building principal and/or director of teaching and learning. The school official will:
  - 1. Treat each request with confidentiality.
  - 2. Provide and explain the school district alternative instruction request process.

- B. Upon receipt of the alternative instruction request:
  - The parent, guardian and/or adult student may submit an alternative instruction plan to the school official and certified staff (i.e. classroom teacher, department head and/or counselor). The school district will not pay for any alternative instruction costs.
  - 2. All parties will review the plan.
  - 3. The principal or designee will determine whether the alternative instruction is essentially equivalent to that provided as part of the adopted curriculum. The school district may evaluate and assess the quality of the student's alternative instruction work for grading purposes.
  - 4. The decision of the principal or designee related to the request is final.

#### Appendix I

An orderly process of instructional resource and supplemental materials review insures an appropriate balance for those most concerned:

- The teachers who have the right to express their professional desires and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The students who have the right to express their desires and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials
- The parents and community who have the right to express their desires and opinions on the review and use of instructional resources and materials

#### The process has three steps:

- 1. Evaluation of instructional materials according to specified criteria
- 2. Creation of a level of awareness among parents and community
- 3. Recommendation to school board for adoption of new instructional resources and materials

The amount of instructional material available makes it possible to offer alternatives to challenged or controversial material. Should students or parents have objections to any material, teachers shall offer substitute selections.

## **Executive Summary of Proposed Debt**

Proposed Issue:	\$22,035,000 General Obligation School Building Refunding Bonds, Series 2019B
Purposes:	The proposed issue will finance a current refunding of the 2021 through 2024 maturities of the \$50,370,000 General Obligation School Building Refunding Bonds, Series 2011B. The purpose of the refunding is to reduce future debt service payments and tax levies.
	The existing bonds have interest rates of 4.00% to 5.0% (see Page 6). Based on current market conditions, we estimate that the new refunding bonds would have interest rates of 1.05% to 1.20% and an expected True Interest Cost of 1.3% (see Page 7). The lower interest rates would reduce future debt service payments by an estimated \$1,465,177 over fiscal years 2020 through 2024 (see page 8). This would cause a reduction in property tax levies for taxes payable in 2020 through 2023. The Net Present Value Benefit of the refunding is estimated to be \$1,414,247, equal to 6.029% of the refunded debt service. Actual results will be determined based on market conditions on the day of sale.
	This refunding is considered to be a Current Refunding as the obligations being refunded will be callable within 90 days of the date of issue of the new Bonds. Debt service will be paid from the District's annual debt service property tax levy.
Authority:	The Bonds are being issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapters 475 and 475.67.  The Bonds will be general obligations of the District for which its full faith, credit and taxing powers are pledged.
Term/Call Feature:	The Bonds are being issued for a term of 4 years, 3 months. Principal on the Bonds will be due on February 1 of 2021 through 2024. Interest will be due every six months beginning August 1, 2020.
	The Bonds are being offered without option of prior redemption.
Bank Qualification:	Because the District is issuing more than \$10,000,000 in tax-exempt obligations during the calendar year, the District will be not able to designate the Bonds as "bank qualified" obligations.
State Credit Enhancement:	By resolution the District will covenant and obligate itself to be bound by the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, which provides for payment by the State of Minnesota in the event of a potential default of a school district obligation.
	To qualify for the credit enhancement, the District must submit an application to the State. Ehlers will coordinate the application process to the State on your behalf.

Rating:	Under current bond ratings, the state credit enhancement would bring a Moody's "Aa2" rating.
	The District's most recent bond issues were rated by Moody's Investors Service. The current ratings on those bonds are "Aaa" (underlying rating) and "Aa2" (credit-enhanced rating). The District will request a new rating for the Bonds.
Basis for Issuance:	Based on our knowledge of your situation and characteristics of various municipal financing options, we are recommending the issuance of General Obligation School Building Refunding Bonds as a suitable option to meet the District's objective of reducing future debt service payments. General Obligation Bonds will result in lower interest rates than some other financing options.
Method of Sale/Placement:	We will solicit competitive bids for the purchase of the Bonds from underwriters and banks.
	We will include an allowance for discount bidding in the terms of the issue. The discount is treated as an interest item and provides the underwriter with all or a portion of their compensation in the transaction.
	If the Bonds are purchased at a price greater than the minimum bid amount (maximum discount), the unused allowance may be used to reduce your borrowing amount.
Premium Pricing:	In some cases, investors in municipal bonds prefer "premium" pricing structures. A premium is achieved when the coupon for any maturity (the interest rate paid by the issuer) exceeds the yield to the investor, resulting in a price paid that is greater than the face value of the bonds. The sum of the amounts paid in excess of face value is considered "reoffering premium." The underwriter of the bonds will retain a portion of this reoffering premium as their compensation (or "discount") but will pay the remainder of the premium to the District. Any net premium received will be used to reduce the principal amount of the Bonds.
Review of Existing Debt:	We have reviewed all outstanding indebtedness for the District and find that, other than the obligations proposed to be refunded by the Bonds, there are no other refunding opportunities at this time.
	We will continue to monitor the market and the call dates for the District's outstanding debt and will alert you to any future refunding opportunities.
Continuing Disclosure:	The District will be agreeing to provide certain updated Annual Financial Information and its Audited Financial Statement annually, as well as providing notices of the occurrence of certain reportable events to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (the "MSRB"), as required by rules of the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). The District is already obligated to provide such reports for its existing bonds and has contracted with Ehlers to prepare and file the reports.

Arbitrage Monitoring:	Because the Bonds tax-exempt obligations, the District must ensure compliance with certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) rules throughout the life of the issue. These rules apply to all gross proceeds of the issue, including initial bond proceeds and investment earnings in construction, escrow, debt service, and any reserve funds. How issuers spend bond proceeds and how they track interest earnings on funds (arbitrage/yield restriction compliance) are common subjects of IRS inquiries. Your specific responsibilities will be detailed in the Signature, No-Litigation, Arbitrage Certificate and Purchase Price Receipt prepared by your Bond Attorney and provided at closing. We recommend that you regularly monitor compliance with these rules and/or retain the services of a qualified firm to assist you.
Investment of Proceeds:	Proceeds from the new Bonds will be available for investment by the District from the closing date (November 14, 2019) until shortly before the February 1, 2020 call date. The attached schedules include an estimate of investment earnings (see page 10).

This refunding is being undertaken based on the assumption that market conditions warrant the refinancing at this time.

- 2. Sale. The District has retained Ehlers & Associates, Inc. (Ehlers) in Roseville, Minnesota, as its independent municipal advisor for the Bonds. Ehlers is authorized to solicit proposals in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 475.60, Subdivision 2(9). If the issuance of the Bonds is approved, the School Board shall meet at the time and place specified in the Official Statement to receive and consider proposals for the purchase of the Bonds.
- 3. Official Statement; Negotiation of Sale. Ehlers is authorized to prepare and distribute an Official Statement and to open, read and tabulate the proposals for presentation to the Board.

- 4. Minnesota School District Credit Enhancement Program. (a) The District hereby covenants and obligates itself to notify the Commissioner of Education of a potential default in the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds and to use the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55 to guarantee payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds when due. The District further covenants to deposit with the Registrar or any successor paying agent three (3) days prior to the date on which a payment is due an amount sufficient to make that payment or to notify the Commissioner of Education that it will be unable to make all or a portion of that payment. The Registrar for the Bonds is authorized and directed to notify the Commissioner of Education if it becomes aware of a potential default in the payment of principal or interest on the Bonds or if, on the day two (2) business days prior to the date a payment is due on the Bonds, there are insufficient funds to make that payment on deposit with the Registrar. The District understands that as a result of its covenant to be bound by the provision of Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, the provisions of that section shall be binding as long as any Bonds of this issue remain outstanding.
- (b) The District further covenants to comply with all procedures now and hereafter established by the Departments of Management and Budget and Education of the State of Minnesota pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 126C.55, subdivision 2(c) and otherwise to take such actions as necessary to comply with that section. ## **Project Description:**

The 10 year LTFM plan includes replacement of the deteriorated mechancial and electrical systems at the Edina Community Center that are approaching the end of their useful life. The building was originally built in 1949 with major additions in 1952, 1959, and 2006. The ventilation in some areas of the building was upgraded in a major renovation project in 2005 but many areas remain with the original equipment including the steam heating plant. The entire building is heated by the original steam plant installed in 1949. Steam to hot water convertors have been installed in various renovation projects including 2006 and 2016 to serve selected areas of the building that had ventilation upgrades.

Ventilation systems installed prior to the 2005 addition and renovation project will be replaced with new systems to provide minimum code required ventilation and include new direct digital controls, dehumidification capability, and filtration systems to meet or exceed current ASHRAE standards. See attached existing systems drawing. The ventilation systems will depend on the type of area served and will include displacement, chilled beam, variable air volume, and constant volume systems. Systems installed in the 2006 addition and renovation project will be converted to hot water operation to be compatible with the new hot water plant and cooling coils will be added for de-humidification capability. Refer to the attached drawings.

The existing steam heating boiler plant has deteriorated and is near the end of its useful life. The proposed work will replace deteriorated systems and provide a new high efficient hot water heating plant and variable primary distribution system to serve all areas of the building

Mechanical ventilation systems renovated in the 2006 addition and renovation projects included de-humidification capabilities. De-humidification is accomplished by two separate air cooled chillers located on the roof. The system were not planned for expansion and are not adequate to serve additional areas of the building. The proposed work includes two new air cooled chiller plants located on the Northwest corner of the roof and South side where the existing air cooled chiller currently resides. The new system will interconnect to the chilled water distribution sytem constructed ion the 2006 project.

Work is planned to start in Fall of 2019 and will be phased for year around construction planned to be complete in the Fall of 2021.

## **Project Work Scope:**

The LTFM work scope includes the following:

- \*Fire Protection: Fire protection modifications necessary for the installation of new systems.
- \*Heating Distribution Piping: The existing steam boiler plant and distribution piping are beyond their useful life. The scope of this project fully converts the building from steam to hot water. New hot water boiler capacity and distribution piping are installed to provide heating to all areas of the building. The distribution system will be connected to the mechanical systems renovated in previous projects.
- \*Dehumidification/Distribution: The exisitng chiller plant is not capable of expansion to serve additional areas of the building. The air cooled chiller plants will be replaced with a two new air cooled chiller plant to provide dehumidification capabilities for all new and existing systems.
- \*Air Handling/Ventilation System: The existing air handling units installed prior to 20005 are beyond their useful life. Refer to the attached proposed drawings for areas of the building that will be retrofit with new ventilation systems. The new systems will be designed to meet or exceed State code required minimum ventilation rates in accordance with the current



adopted ASHRAE 62 guidelines. All new ventilation systems will have dehumidification capability with humidity sensors located to maintain a maximum space humidity level of 55% and a maximum humidity level of 60% at the coolest surface. The systems are designed in accordance with the Minnesota Energy Code for the following conditions: Summer 88 degrees Fahrenheit dry bulb/72 degrees web bulb, winter -15 degrees Fahrenheit dry bulb. Inside winter design temperature is 70 degrees, summer design temperature is 74 degrees

\*Building Automation System: New direct digital controls will be provided for the new mechanical systems as an extension of the existing building automation system.

\*Electrical Power/Systems: New power connections for new mechanical systems are included in the scope of this project. No energy savings or performance contracts will be included. Provide power connections to new mechanical equipment and replace deteriorated distribution panels as required. Relocate existing electrical systems including sound, clocks, etc... only as required to install new mechanical systems. These electrical systems are re-used to the greatest extent possible. Deteriorated lighting is replaced in areas receiving new ceilings and is configured to coordinate with new distribution ductwork. Modify the existing fire alarm system as necessary to include the addition of new duct smoke detectors located in new mechanical systems and to relocate devices necessary to accommodate new mechanical systems.

- \*Structural Reinforcement: Structural reinforcement as necessary for the installation of new mechanical systems.
- \*General Construction (Roof, Chases, Ceilings, Soffits): All ceilings, chases, and soffits are that are modified or replaced to accommodate the new mechanical systems.
- \*Testing Balancing and Commissioning: Testing, balancing and commissioning of new mechanical systems.

Refer to attached drawings for project work scope. The drawings show both the total project work scope.

## **Project Cost:**

The majority of the work will be funded through LTFM funding. The project also includes \$1,200,000 of capital funding for concurrent renovation work in the Board Room and Locker Room. The total funding related to LTFM to implement the work described here-in is \$31,722,013. FY20 = \$16,341,814, FY21 = \$15,380,199.

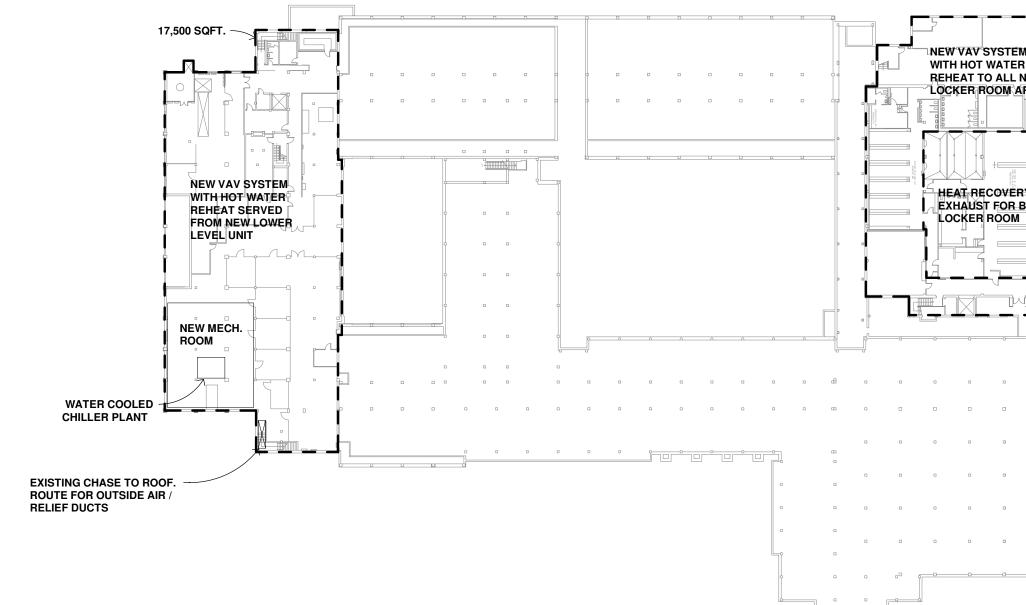

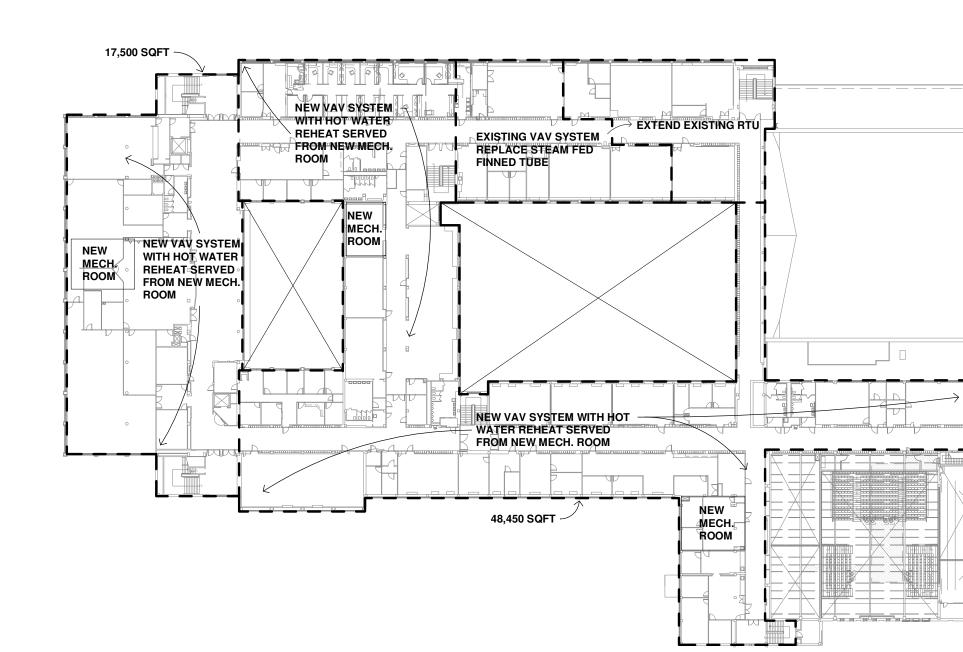














## **Project Description:**

The 10 year LTFM plan includes replacement of the deteriorated mechancial and electrical systems at the Valley View Middle School that are aproaching the end of their useful life. The building was originally built in 1964 with a major addition in 2006. A multi-phased project through the summers of 2018 and 2019 is replacing the mechanical systems primarily in the classroom areas on the east half of the building with new induction displacement and chilled beam and variable air volume systems. Refer to the attached drawings for renovated areas. The ventilation systems in the west half of the building that were installed prior to 2006 will be replaced. The entire building is heated by the original steam plant installed in 1964. A steam to hot water convertor was installed in the 2018–2019 project to serve the renovated areas with hot water. The proposed project will complete the conversion of the building to hot water.

Ventilation systems installed prior to 2006 will be replaced with new systems to provide minimum code required ventilation and include new direct digital controls, dehumidification capability, and filtration systems to meet or exceed current ASHRAE standards. See attached existing systems drawing. The ventilation systems will depend on the type of area served and will include displacement, chilled beam, variable air volume, and constant volume systems. Systems installed in the 2006 addition and renovation project will be converted to hot water operation to be compatible with the new hot water plant and cooling coils will be added for de-humidification capability. Refer to the attached drawings.

The existing steam heating boiler plant has deteriorated and is near the end of its useful life. The proposed work will replace deteriorated systems and provide a new high efficient hot water heating plant and variable primary distribution system to serve all areas of the building., The plant will be connected to the serve the mechanical systems that were installed in the 2018-2019 project.

The 2018-2019 project included the installation of a new air cooled chiller plant sized to serve the entire biulding. The proposed work includes extended the exisiting plant distribution system to serve the new mechnical systems.

Work is planned to start in Spring of 2020 and will be phased over 2 years depending on the availability of funding.

## Project Work Scope:

The LTFM work scope includes the following:

- \*Fire Protection: Fire protection modifications necessary for the installation of new systems.
- \*Heating Distribution Piping: The existing steam boiler plant and distribution piping are beyond their useful life. The scope of this project completes the full conversion of the building from steam to hot water. New hot water boiler capacity and distribution piping are installed to provide heating to all areas of the building. The distribution system will be connected to the systems completed in the 2018-2019 project.
- \*Dehumidification/Distribution: The chiller plant constructed in the 2018-2019 project is sized to handle the entire building. The project will extend new piping from this system to new air handling systems.
- \*Air Handling/Ventilation System: The existing air handling units installed prior to 2005 are beyond their useful life. Refer to the attached proposed drawings for areas of the building that will be retrofit with new ventialtion systems. The new systems will be designed to meet or exceed State code required minimum ventilation rates in accordance with the current adopted ASHRAE 62 guidelines. All new ventilation systems will have dehumidification capability with humidity sensors located to maintain a maximum space humidity level of 55% and a maximum humidity level of 60% at the coolest surface. The systems are designed in accordance with the Minnesota Energy Code for the following conditions: Summer 88 degrees



Fahrenheit dry bulb/72 degrees web bulb, winter -15 degrees Fahrenheit dry bulb. Inside winter design temperature is 70 degrees, summer design temperature is 74 degrees

\*Building Automation System: New direct digital controls will be provided for the new mechanical systems as an extension of the existing building automation system.

\*Electrical Power/Systems: New power connections for new mechanical systems are included in the scope of this project. No energy savings or performance contracts will be included. Provide power connections to new mechanical equipment and replace deteriorated distribution panels as required. 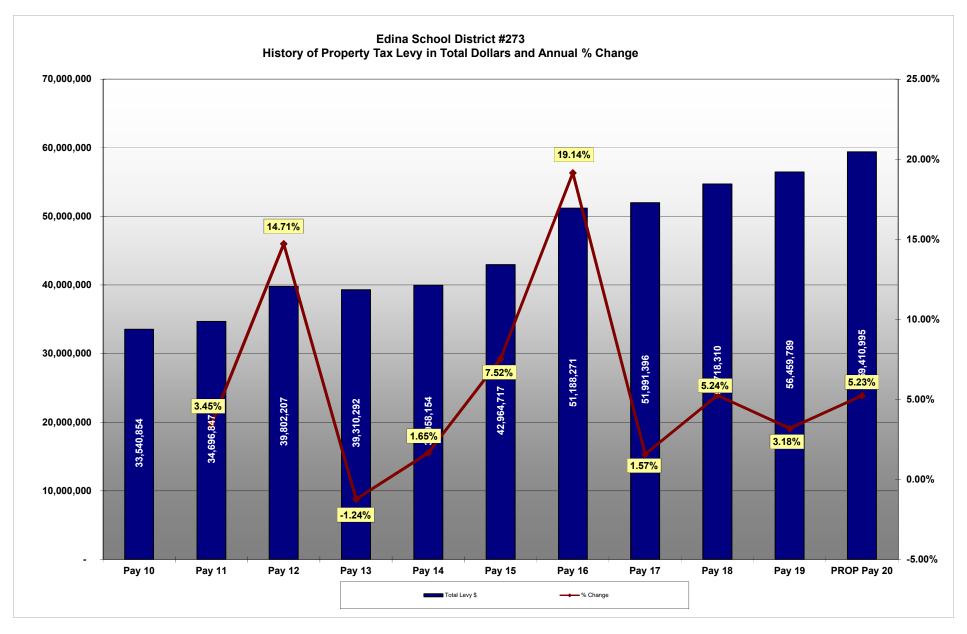
